Take a look at the compound adjectives below:

2.	flame-red
3.	mouth-watering
4.	steel-grey
5.	cat-like

6.	blood-red
7.	baby-faced
8.	sure-footed
9.	bull-headed
10.	stony-faced

Use each one of these compound adjectives in a vivid sentence to show your understanding. If you want to impress, use some as a form of imagery (simile, metaphor or personification).
