# Definitions

**Interrupt-** to stop a person from speaking for a short period by something you say or do

**Internal-** inside a building, body, mind, organisation or country

**Interpose** -to put yourself or something between two things, people, or groups, especially in order to stop them doing something

**Interloper** - someone who becomes involved in an activity or a social group without being asked, or enters a place without permission

**Intertwine** - to twist or be twisted together, or to be connected so as to be difficult to separate

**Interject** - to say something while another person is speaking

**Internet** - the large system of connected computers around the world that allows people to share information and communicate with each other



## Define it:

**Inter** = Latin for **between/among**

**Intersperse** - to spread things out at intervals

Try to **intersperse** bursts of exercise throughout your week.



**Intermittent** - happening at random intervals

I go to the gym **intermittently**.



**Intercept** - to get between someone and their destination

The police **intercepted** the criminal before he could escape
