- **Corpse** – Dead body – usually of a human

Define it:

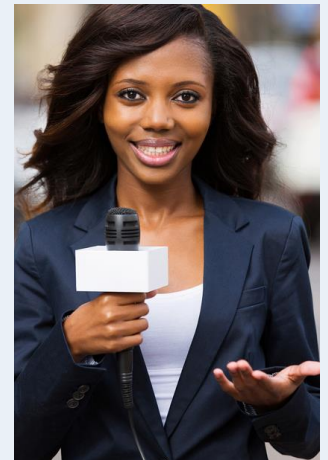
Corp = Latin for **body**
