Definitions

- **Structure** – the arrangement of parts or elements of something complex/a building or other object constructed from several parts.
- **Infrastructure** – the basic physical and/or organisational structures needed to function
- **Destruction** – breaking down something so that there is nothing left
- **Obstruction** – an object that prevents you getting through

Define it:

Struct = Latin for **build**

Instruction - knowledge or information imparted to build knowledge
The **instructions** are in the box.



Construction - the art of building something
Construction of the new bridge will start in spring.

Instructor - A person who teaches something and builds knowledge
