Definitions

- **Hydrangea** – A beautiful plant that needs lots of water
- **Hydrant** - a fitting in a street or other public place with a nozzle by which a hose may be attached to a water main.
- **Hydraulics** -the passage of liquids through pipes and channels, especially as a source of mechanical force or control.

Define it:

Hydra or Hydro = Greek for **water**

Dehydrate - to lose or remove water from something
After running this morning I am so **dehydrated**.



Hydrophobia -An extreme fear of water.
Hydrophobia is a symptom of rabies in humans.

Hydroplane -A seaplane; a boat that can rise or light
on water
Last summer we went on a **hydroplane**.
