# Definitions

- **Caption** – To take a lot of information and produce a short piece of text that describes the picture or explains what the people in it are doing or saying.
- **Captive** - a person who has been taken prisoner or an animal that has been confined.
- **Capable** –having/taking the ability, fitness, or quality necessary to do or achieve a specified thing.

## Define it:

**Capio** = Latin for **I take/have**

**Capture** - to take someone as a prisoner, or to take something into your possession.

I think it is cruel when my brother **captures** butterflies.



**Capsule** - To take a part of a spacecraft in which the people on it live.

Living in a space **capsule** is a little bit claustrophobic.

**captivate** - to hold the attention of someone by being extremely interesting, exciting, pleasant, or attractive.

His singing was **captivating**.
