Definitions

Democracy – The belief in freedom and equality between people, or a government based on this belief. Power is either held by elected representatives or directly by the people themselves.

Academic – A teacher or scholar in a university or other institute of higher education/used to describe someone who is clever and enjoys studying.

Demography – The study of changes in the number of births, marriages, deaths, etc. in a particular area during a period of time.

Define it:

Dem = Greek for 'People'

Democracy - Sweden is often held up as an example of a successful social **democracy**.

Academic - The school is noted for its **academic** excellence.

Demography - The increase in the number of young people leaving to work in the cities has had a dramatic impact on the **demography** of the villages.
